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Description

The territory of Campiglia Marittima, located on a hill of 280 meters above sea level, is located between the alluvial plain of the Cornia river and the Metalliferous Hills and together with other neighboring municipalities in the province of Livorno. constitutes the area of the Val di Cornia.

Its existence is documented from the eleventh century and represents, in the whole of the Rocca and its historic center, a complex of considerable interest, also enriched by the proximity of the Archaeological Mining Park of San Silvestro.

Until 1200 Campiglia was a fief of the Della Gherardesca family. It was they who transformed the original village of huts into a castle, first mentioned as such in 1004.

The first structure built was a massive tower, the keep, now home to the museum of archaeological finds found on site, later flanked by the palace itself. The economic power is well demonstrated by a series of particular and refined architectural devices, certainly the work of specialized workers, coming from Pisan shipyards. In the thirteenth century these buildings were flanked on the south-west side by a high tower equipped with a cistern and on the north-west side a building also in the shape of a tower, unfortunately today almost totally destroyed. From the end of the century until the end of the fifteenth century, following contrasts between the Counts of Campiglia and Pisa, part of the buildings were occupied by a garrison sent by the city and following the Florentine conquest of these territories, the military contingent, this time sent from Florence, became more numerous and occupied the fortress until the end of the sixteenth century. From this moment, as Florence no longer had to fear attacks from anyone, Campiglia gradually began to lose strategic importance with consequent military and economic degradation. Its importance diminished to the point that, in 1664, the land within the walls of the Rocca was leased as agricultural land.





After centuries of abandonment, the greatest damage to the structure occurred at the hands of civilians: in 1930-31 Campiglia needed a new aqueduct, which was positioned not at the highest point of the town. Unfortunately, to make room for the new building, the Torre della Cisterna was practically destroyed, of which only part of the cistern itself and the south-east corner remain, and the Palace, of which only the north front facing the village, embellished with an elaborate Romanesque mullioned window, has survived. Today the whole village is enclosed by a stone wall (enlarged over the centuries), for the most part preserved (especially the front under the Rocca) or easily identifiable, equipped with three gates still intact. Another precious attraction of the village is certainly the Parish Church of S. Giovanni del XII, with a Romanesque layout, a single nave with apse and transept. It is located on the cemetery hill, just outside the historic center.

The grey limestone construction made of regular blocks is enhanced by friezes and bas-reliefs. The construction of the parish church probably responded to the needs dictated by the population increase by replacing a previous church in its functions. An inscription on the façade façade, in addition to indicating the year of construction, provides the reference of the master responsible for the construction company: Matteo. The architectural features refer to models of classical ancestry typical of Pisan architecture of the late eleventh and twelfth centuries, as evidenced by the two small portals on the façade and on the north side. The latter portal is characterized by the architrave consisting of a single white marble block with scenes of wild boar hunting symbolizing the defeat of evil by Christ, of sculptural production of the seventies and eighties of the twelfth century. On an external wall of the northern transept there is an inscription engraved on the stone, below the roof, which bears the famous palindromic phrase "SATOR AREPO TENET OPERA ROTAS" common to many other medieval buildings.

<p>Pathway from the car park to the starting point</p>	<p>The car park is located in Piazza V. Veneto, the starting point of the itinerary. Two other stalls indicated in the report and located in Campiglia in Via A. Moro, are located near Via Buoizzi (secondary entrance of the itinerary)</p> <p>The path being linear can be traveled from the beginning of Piazza V. Veneto or from Via Buoizzi, where nearby there are 2 stalls for people with reduced mobility. For this reason, we recommend that you start the route depending on where you parked.</p> <p>Distance from Piazza V. Veneto – starting point: about 20 meters.</p> <p>Distance: from Via A. Moro – starting point, about 52 meters</p> <p>Our itinerary starts from Piazza V. Veneto. 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Description of the itinerary

Porta Ribellino (to the sea): facing south-west, it is the main gateway to Campiglia. It is located overlooking Via Vittorio Veneto. The ashlar of the arch probably originate from a medieval construction and form an arch in the façade of a building that was transformed from the simple original features in the first half of the twentieth century, so as to take on the appearance of a Gothic building in harmony with the fashion of the time.

Continuing forward for about 48 meters on the left side we find the Town Hall. The peculiarity of the building is the wall panel that illustrates the reconciliation of ancient weights and measures with the new decimal metrics, both as regards linear measurements and capacity measurements of liquids, weights and grains. Further on, at number 8, the Provostry of San Lorenzo overlooks.

Accessibility:

The historic center is accessible in its entirety. Some points, due to the medieval nature of the configuration of the village, have slopes.

After passing the Porta Ribellino, continue straight on along Via Roma on a smooth stone block pavement.



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Continuing forward for about 48 meters on the same pavement and with a slope of 8%, on the left side, we find the Town Hall with a double-leaf door and a step of varying height from 20 cm to 10 cm.

The length of the route from the Town Hall to the Provostship of San Lorenzo in Via Roma 8, is 12 meters, with a gradient of 8%

The door of the religious building has two leaves with a net opening of 180 cm and an entrance step that varies from 26 cm to 10 cm. Inside there is an additional door with a net opening of 180 cm.

The church, already attested in medieval times, has a Latin cross plan and a single nave. The hexagonal marble baptismal font, dated 1560, is decorated with quadrangular tiles. In 1987, a terracotta statue of the Virgin Mary, the work of the sculptor Alberto Ceppi, was placed in the niche on the façade.





From the left transept, on whose altar there is a polychrome wooden sculpture of the first half of the seventeenth century, depicting Our *Lady of Sorrows in the act of showing her heart pierced by swords*, you enter the oratory of the Misericordia.

Of note are the *Madonna and Child*, attributed to the master San Torpè (early fourteenth century), the wooden group of the *Annunciation* (seventeenth century), the *Adoration of the shepherds* (seventeenth century) and Saints *Lawrence and Anthony adoring the Virgin* (1636), attributable to Jacopo Vignali

Leaving the church, continue on an uphill path of about 5 meters, until you find Piazza Garibaldi on the right with a statue of the hero of the two worlds, patriot, politician, general and leading figure of the Risorgimento.

From Piazza Garibaldi begins a further ramp that joins Piazza della Repubblica, characterized by historic buildings, clubs and craft shops.

Accessibility:

The length of the ramp from the Prepositura di San Lorenzo to Piazza Garibaldi is 5 meters, with a slope of 9%.

From Piazza Garibaldi begins a further ramp of 45 meters long and gradient varying from 8% to 14% which joins Piazza della Repubblica.

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Piazza della Repubblica is paved with smooth stone blocks, flat and free of obstacles. The square is located in the historic center and was built in the mid-sixteenth century and expanded in the nineteenth with palaces obtained from medieval tower houses. It also has a beautiful view of the Praetorian Palace.

On the façade of a historic building overlooking the square we find a rectangular marble plaque dedicated to Francesco Ferrer.

In the tombstone, at the bottom left, the image of a hand clutches a torch over an open book and reports the answer that Ferrer gave to his executioners "thought does not die, the modern school, will write your condemnation with my blood". The plaque was affixed on the day of the 1st anniversary of the death of Ferrer, a Spanish anarchist, pedagogue, freemason and free thinker. The plaque was removed and destroyed in 1922 after the advent of fascism, so the current one represents a marble copy, relocated by the FAI in 2012.

From Piazza della Repubblica we continue on an uphill path arriving exactly up to Via Cavour 1, from where we can admire the Palazzo Pretorio with the coats of arms of all the podestà who have followed one another over the centuries. Of thirteenth-century origin, this ancient residence of the Captain of Justice has been modified several times over the centuries. The Praetorian Palace towers over the buildings thanks to a sturdy clock tower completed by a beautiful bell. It currently houses the Historical Archive, the Children's Library "Il palazzo dei Racconti", the Carlo Guarnieri Museum, the Tourist Information Office and some exhibition rooms for temporary exhibitions. For some years now, the palace has been home to the Hall of Weddings and Civil Unions, named after "Valentino Polidori", an integral part of the Guarnieri Museum, of which it houses some large canvases by the painter-xylographer, born and lived for a long time in Campiglia.

Going back towards Piazza della Repubblica on the right side there is a passage with a round arch. Beyond the gate immediately on the left we find Piazza del Mercato, a characteristic twentieth-century square among the medieval tower houses.





Continuing towards Via Buozzi you arrive at the Porta Pisana, facing north-west, near the nineteenth-century Teatro dei Concordi. Today's gate is the result of a reconstruction that took place in the sixteenth century, while the original gate was incorporated in the same century into the bastion reinforcing the walls that in the twentieth century was used as an access to the Cinema, now the entrance to the Mannelli Civic Center.

Past the door on the right, the renowned Teatro dei Concordi. Built on the initiative of some notables of Campiglia to a design by the engineer Francesco Fedi, the new theater was inaugurated on December 26, 1867: it had an elliptical hall with three orders of boxes and was able to accommodate 600 spectators. The theater ceased activity in 1929 and reopened in 1938 after being adapted into a cinema. It was renovated in 1964, during which the original features were modified. After running the risk of being totally destroyed to allocate the space to civilian housing, in 1974 it was purchased by the Municipality of Campiglia Marittima which renovated it again, leading to its reopening in April 1990.

Accessibility

From Piazza della Repubblica, continuing straight on a path of about 24 meters and a slope varying from 16.6% to 21.5% and arriving exactly up to Via Cavour 1, we can admire the Praetorian Palace.

Going back towards Piazza della Repubblica on the right side there is a passage with a round arch 14 meters long and a slope of 7%

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Events

The main events of Campiglia Marittima combine folklore, culture and ancient food and wine traditions. The main event of the village, not to be missed is:

1. **ApritiBorgo – ABC Festival:** The famous international festival of street theatre and microtheatre. For five days, from mid-August, the squares and streets of the village come alive with hundreds of shows, music and artistic performances. Along the streets of the center will be set up the traditional food market with local specialties, street food and handicrafts. Generally all shows start late afternoon (from 18:30 with the opening of the markets) and continue until past midnight. Access to the festival is **subject to a fee** with the purchase of an entrance ticket or a multi-day pass.
