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## Description

**Peccioli** is a combination of medieval architecture and contemporary art, with a historic center that can be defined as an open-air museum.

In Via Mazzini there is a multi-storey paid car park with a large lift, equipped with a Braille keyboard, to reach the town in Via del Giardino.

The multi-storey car park is subject to charges. For stays of less than 60 minutes it is free. Hourly cost €1.



For the disabled, holders of the CUDE badge, it is possible to have free admission, with reserved spaces on each floor, by sending an email attaching a copy of the vehicle's registration document to [info@belvedere.peccioli.net](mailto:info@belvedere.peccioli.net)

There are toilets adapted for the physically disabled on the first floor.

## Description of the itinerary

<p>Description of the itinerary</p> 	<p>Our itinerary starts from Piazza del Carmine. Here we find the <b>Church of the Carmine</b> accessible via a short ramp to access the churchyard and a second short ramp to access the interior, with slopes that do not exceed 8%.</p> <p>The church was built in 1642 in bricks and is surrounded on three sides by a loggia. Inside, two plaques in memory of the earthquake that destroyed the church in 1846, totally restored four years later.</p>
	

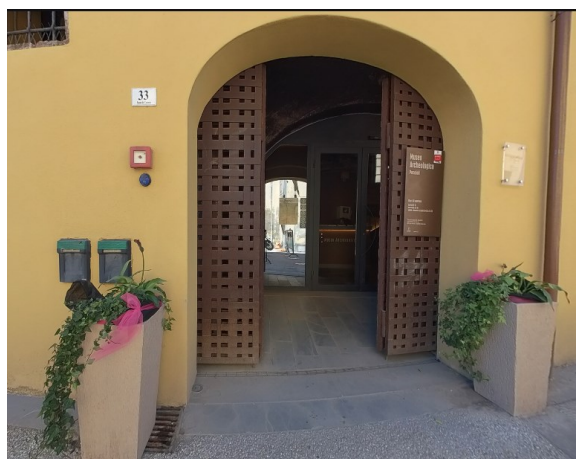




Continue from Piazza del Carmine and at the end of the square, at number 33, on the left we find the **Archaeological Museum**

The Museum is accessible via a 120 cm long ramp, with a 7% slope and sliding door; the internal rooms are accessible on the flat or with ramps. The Longobardi room is accessible via a 454 cm long ramp with a 20% slope.

The museum is developed within a system of tunnels that in ancient times contained underground tombs.



The museum houses the finds found within the municipal territory, especially in the Etruscan site of Ortaglia and in the Archaeological Area of Santa Mustiola

A little further on we find the Multipurpose Center which has two rooms and an urban terrace intended for events and exhibitions

The structure is accessible on the flat and inside a bathroom equipped for the motor disabled



Continue along Corso Giacomo Matteotti until you reach Piazza del Popolo.

The flooring is made of concrete tiles that can be easily walked on in a wheelchair





Palazzo Comunale, in Piazza del Pololo, number 1

Accessible via 3 steps that can be overcome via a 430 cm long side ramp, 126 cm wide and 4% slope



Just past the Town Hall on the left you reach the Praetorian Palace and the Parish Church of San Verano with the museum of sacred art, one in front of the other

The **Parish Church of San Verano**, in Piazza Fra' Domenico da Peccioli, can be reached via a short ramp 43 cm long with a 19% slope and entrance with an internal step 12 cm high and a removable wooden ramp which, however, was not present at the time of the visit.





The **Parish Church of San Verano** was built in the eleventh century and is one of the best examples of Pisan Romanesque style buildings.

The bell tower dates back to 1885, the work of the architect Bellincioni.

Inside the Christian temple there are ancient works by Tuscan and Italian artists. The Crucifix behind the altar dates back to the eighteenth century

### **Museum of Sacred Art**

Inaugurated in 2009, it is located inside the Parish Church of San Verano, **in the Chapel of the Assumption**, accessible via a 190 cm long ramp with an 8% slope and a door with a width of 116 cm.





The **chapel** was added to the parish church in 1580 to house the Compagnia dell'Assunta. Inside there are valuable works, including seventeenth-century paintings by the painter Jacopo Vignali. The ancient coffered ceiling in gilded wood is admirable. Inside the chapel there are the priory bench and the singers' benches, built in the seventeenth century.

To access the second room, you have to overcome an internal step 8 cm high



In front of the Parish Church of San Verano we find the **Palazzo Pretorio** in Piazza del Popolo, 5, tel. 0587 672158. The Palace is accessible from the entrance of the Tourist Information office through 3 steps that can be overcome on the flat by means of a side platform equipped with a handrail.

On the way from the ticket office to the lift, you have to overcome a double ramp 693 cm long with a maximum gradient of 13%.





The elevator that leads to the 4 exhibition floors has a door with a width of 79 cm, a width and depth of the cabin 111x136 cm and an internal button keypad that is 130 cm higher.

To reach the 5th floor where the balcony is located between the roofs it is necessary to use a stairlift which was not working at the time of the visit.

The equipped toilet is located on the second floor




The ancient **Praetorian Palace**, dating back to medieval times and remodeled between the eighteenth and nineteenth centuries

Inside the Museum there are three collections: "F. Bigazzi" Collection of Russian Icons, Belvedere S.p.A. Collection of Icons, Engravings and Lithographs Collection

	<p>On the first floor there is a 170 cm long ramp with a 16% slope, while the second and third floors are flat.</p> <p>On the fourth floor, a 205 cm long ramp with a slope of 12.5 %</p> <p>Accessible toilets are located on the second floor accessible (see Toilets tab)</p>
	
 	<p>After passing the Parish Church of San Verano and the Praetorian Palace, continue straight on Via Carraia where at number 11 we find the entrance to the <b>Timeless Palace</b></p> <p>The entrance is accessible only via two steps; for those with reduced mobility, it is recommended to reach the Panoramic Terrace through Via Bastioni, uphill, with a first ramp 8 meters long, with a slope of 8/12% and a final ramp under a tunnel, 15 m long with a slope of 15%.</p>

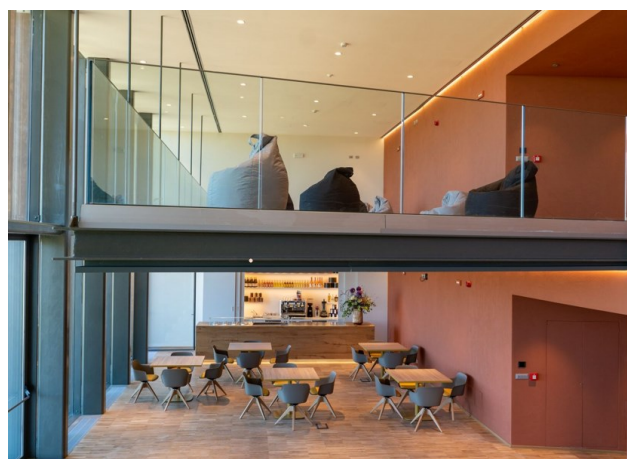




From the panoramic terrace you enter the atrium of the **Palazzo senza Tempo**, where there is the elevator that connects the floors, with the exception of the last one which can only be reached by stairs or stairlifts.

The width of the elevator door is 80 cm, car width and depth 92X130 cm, call button 112 cm high.

Inside, on the second floor, there is also a cafeteria. Here there are also two equipped toilets, on the ground floor and near the cafeteria (see toilets section).

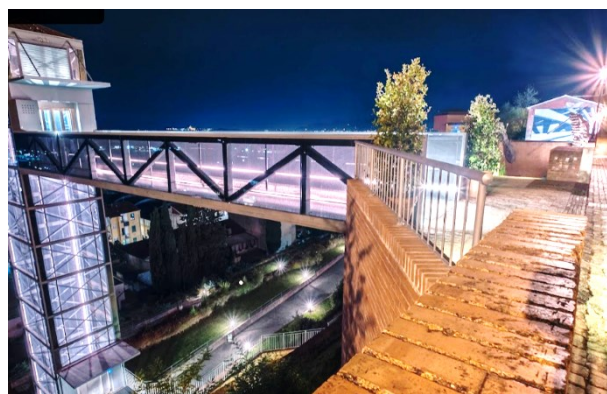




Last but certainly not least is the evocative work of art **Endless Sunset** by Patrick Tuttofuoco created in 2020 in Peccioli to transform the simple walkway that connects the ancient heart of the village to its most modern part into a work of art.

The shape of the circle recalls cyclicity, the passage of time, The idea of applying a chromatic gradient to this three-dimensional shape that takes up the 45 minutes in which the sky sets is great.

The work is part of the **MACCA (Open Air Museum of Contemporary Art)**, a widespread museum that extends over the entire territory of Peccioli and its hamlets





Outside the town, about 9 km away, we find the **Green Triangle Ecological Park and the Statues of the Giants**, which can be reached by car by reservation. They are also part of the **MACCA (Open-Air Museum of Contemporary Art)** where there are **two majestic sculptures**, from 5 to 9 meters high, made of polystyrene and polyurethane foam, covered with cement fibers resistant to external agents. The other two are located at the **Amphitheater of Fonte Mazzola and on the roof of the business incubator in**



It has a dirt car park mixed with grass, with parking spaces reserved for the disabled, during organized events and assistance staff.

The path to the amphitheater and the covered pavilion is quite passable even by those in wheelchairs.





The Green Triangle is an area that goes far beyond the simple definition of a **landfill**, managed by the **Belvedere SPA** company, this structure has been transformed into a real multifunctional center, where the creation of clean energy is only a part and integrates with conferences, fashion shows, concerts inside an enchanting amphitheater and much more.

Inside there is a multimedia station with toilets equipped with a 50 cm high toilet, open front tooth, grab bars even if poorly positioned and front and right side space of more than 90 cm. Open type floor-level shower with wall-mounted seat and flexible
